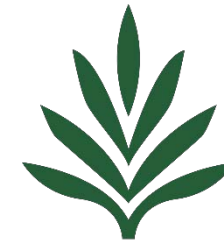
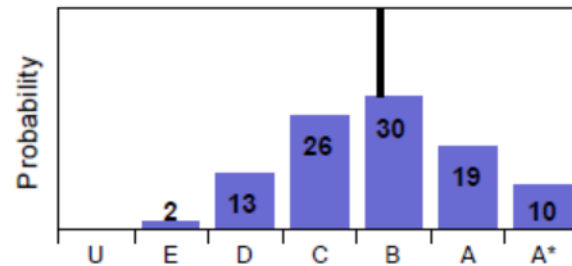
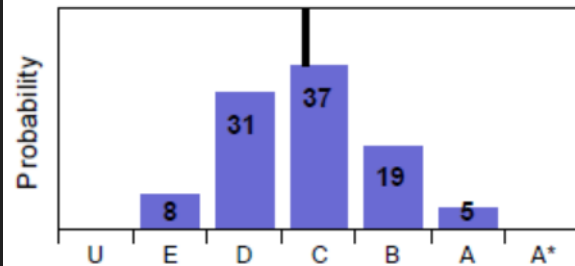
GCSE - A2-Biology - Adaptive Test

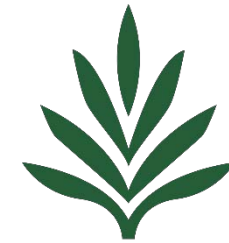

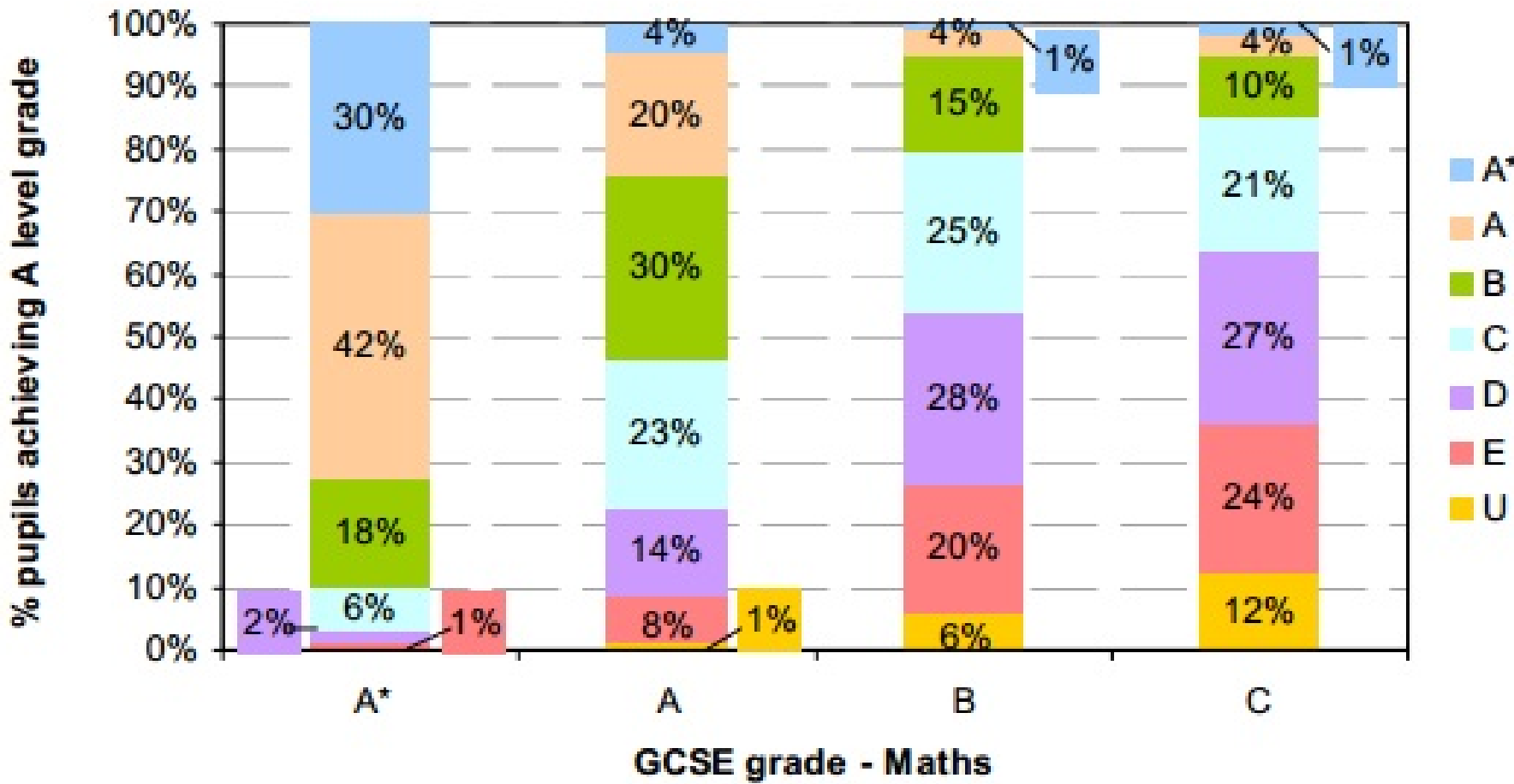

Chart 3.11: Impact of GCSE grade on A level attainment - maths⁶



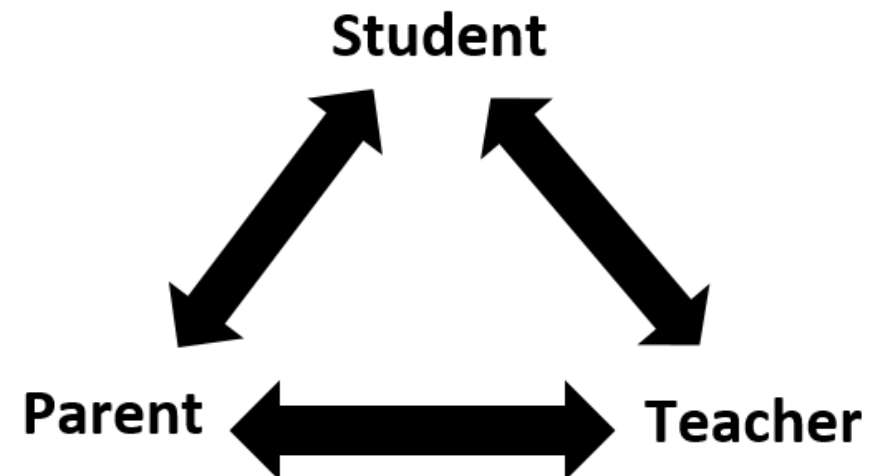
