## Use of Motorcycles

The College's rules and regulations concerning the use of motorcycles, in common with other island secondary schools, have been drawn up in association with the Guernsey Police

### Girls may ride motorcycles to school provided they comply with the following conditions:

- They must first obtain Certificate of Compulsory Basic Training (CBT4). 'L' plates are permitted
- Have insurance cover for the motorcycle
- They receive permission from the Principal by producing the attached completed form (see below), together with their driving licence, Certificate CBT4 and a reflective jacket (see note 2 below)
- Motorcycle parking is available on school premises. The rider must dismount in Rocquettes Lane and wheel the motorcycle into the school grounds

**N.B.** Girls may **NOT** carry pillion passengers

### Uniform

Please observe the following:

1. Uniform skirts may be replaced by plain, dark coloured (navy or black) jeans. In addition, waterproof jackets and trousers also in plain dark colours (navy or black) with reflective material either fixed or added may be worn. These are available from motorcycle dealers and motorcycle accessory shops

**N.B.** Jeans and jackets in other colours are **NOT** acceptable

2. Reflective jackets **MUST** be worn when travelling to and from school. These are available from the same shops, certain types of jacket are also supplied with protective body armour
