Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s)

Shortly after half-term you will receive your daughter's mock examination results, followed at the end of this term by a full report. In the meantime, each girl in the Sixth Form will have a one-to-one meeting with their tutors, myself or Mr Henderson on 10<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> March. The purpose of these meetings is to encourage the girls to reflect on the progress they have made so far and consider any specific areas on which they need to focus as they move through their courses. It's also another opportunity for us simply to catch-up with them individually, which we value as part of our ongoing pastoral provision.

The full report is sent at the end of this term as we feel it is most important that you receive detailed feedback about your daughter's progress before the Easter break. In addition to teacher comments and suggested targets, the reports will also include the marks and grades the students have achieved in their mock examinations. However, if at any time you have concerns about any aspect of your daughter's final months at College, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Please continue to encourage and support your daughter, as we are doing; these last months will be crucial in determining final grades and, for most, entry into their first choice of Higher Education or employment. The vast majority continue to work very hard and this group is being joined by an increasing number who realise that time is becoming short and study needs to be the priority over the coming months.

Finally, a notification that the first of this year's Principals' Lectures (which all Sixth Formers are expected to attend) takes place shortly after half-term. We are delighted to announce that the speakers will be Steven Moffat and his wife, Sue Vertue, lead writer and producer respectively of the BBC series *Dr Who* and *Sherlock*. The lecture takes place in the Elizabeth College hall on **Thursday 5th March**, starting at 18:00 and finishing at approximately 19:30. Students should attend in uniform.
