Frequently Asked Questions

What are the age restrictions for social media platforms?

Net Aware is a website that provides guidance to parents about social media applications and the age restrictions of these platforms. There are several software applications available to help parents manage what students can access and download onto their device. The College network automatically filters and monitors unsuitable content, including stopping social media notifications, which is why we recommend that your daughter connects to our College wifi rather than using 4G, during the working day here.

What should my daughter do if she wants to report a concern?

We encourage your daughter to talk to her form tutor, year coordinator, or any adult in College, and ask that you reinforce this message at home. There is also a 'whisper button' (shown below) which can be found on the College launch pad (RM Unify), which allows a student to report any concern, in confidence, and which will be followed-up sensitively.

Who should I speak to if I would like to discuss a concern?
