Food Technology and Photography

I am delighted to let you know that the renovation of the building beside The Guild Field is complete. It will be officially opened early next term, although the building will be in use from 11 January 2021, with Sixth Form students able to access the photography dark room and Key Stage 3 students (Remove, Lower Four and Upper Four) having an 8-week rotation with Food Technology, included as part of their Design Technology timetable. Our plan is to provide all ingredients in College and an additional charge will be made to cover costs for the food, which we hope will be enjoyed at home. If your daughter is in Key Stage 3, please look out for a separate information letter, which I understand you have already received. Once established, we will explore additional Enrichment and co-curricular opportunities.

Lunch charges from January 2021

We will be increasing our prices in The Core for the Senior School and Sixth Form with effect from 5 January 2021. Our prices have not changed for several years and an increase is now necessary due to the rising cost of food and supplies. The revised prices can be found on the website, together with menus for the Lent term. For those students who have a daily spend limit applied to their account, we will be increasing the daily limit from £7 to £7.50 to accommodate these changes. Some students have overdrawn balances on their Core accounts, and we request that sufficient funds are transferred to clear these before the beginning of the Lent term.

BYOD update

One of the impacts of the last year has been to catalyse the use of technology in all areas of school life. Our Digital Strategy is in the final year of roll-out, with the expectation that, by September 2021, all Remove to Upper Five students will have either a Microsoft Surface Go or Pro as their digital learning device.

Many universities and businesses have been using Microsoft Teams and some of our Sixth Formers have had their interviews over Teams. Future plans include students in Upper Four gaining professional Microsoft qualifications, consideration of Information Technology as a new option in Lower Five, the use of interactive textbooks in languages and provision of subject-specific software such as Sibelius (music composition) or Photoshop (digital photography) to enable students to work on their own devices.

We fully agree with the view sometimes expressed that there are more important things to be talking to the girls about than uniform, yet it is a key expectation. If older girls come to school wearing the correct uniform, time is saved and the conversation about the standard of uniform need not take place.

Specifically, we would like to remind you of our expectations about jewellery.

In Melrose, the handbook states:

Watches, Girls are allowed to wear **inexpensive** watches or fitbits which should be marked with their name. The School accepts no responsibility in the case of loss. These should be unobtrusive and in white or a dark colour.

Earrings only plain gold or silver studs are allowed and these must be removed by the child for P.E lessons. Alternatively, they may be covered in tape or left out on P.E days.

Hair which touches the shoulder must be tied back. Hairbands/scrunchies should be plain green, brown, black or navy or striped to match the summer dress. Sunglasses are permitted.

In Senior School, the handbook states:

For health and safety reasons the wearing of jewellery is not permitted. If ears have been pierced only the simple, small gold or silver ring or stud type of sleeper (one per ear lobe) is permitted.

Cartilage piercings may not be worn to school.

In Sixth Form, the handbook states:

Jewellery may be worn in moderation (one small ring, one plain bracelet, one small plain necklace). If ears have been pierced only the simple, small gold or silver ring or stud type of sleeper (one per ear lobe) is permitted. Cartilage earrings and facial piercings are not permitted.

We believe this guidance is simple, clear and reasonable, yet increasing numbers of girls are choosing to ignore it, despite repeated reminders. From January 2021, girls will be asked to take out earrings which we feel are not appropriate. I am sure that you will appreciate that it is impossible to produce a comprehensive list of what is and is not acceptable. We will make judgement calls when necessary and we welcome your cooperation in helping us meet our uniform expectations.

Lost Property

Please ensure items are named. We encourage the girls to take home their belongings and look after them. This starts with the 'Peas' and 'Beans' at Melrose and applies all the way through the College.

We understand that items can end up in the wrong bags, can be picked up by mistake, or that it can feel embarrassing to return something overdue. We are therefore holding an AMNESTY, with no questions asked for the return of items such as books, folders containing artwork, uniform, or anything else we can reunite with its owner, until 8 January 2021.

We have already received a purse containing a considerable amount of money but with no way of finding the rightful owner. Please contact principalspa@ladiescollege.ac.gg if you believe the item might be yours.

Summer 2021 Exam Arrangements

The UK Government has announced a package of 'exceptional measures' aimed at improving fairness and preventing disruption. These are:

- More generous grading than usual, in line with national outcomes from 2020, so students this year are not disadvantaged;
- Students receiving advance notice of some topic areas covered in GCSE, AS and A-levels to focus revision;
- Exam aids like formula sheets provided in some exams giving students more confidence and reducing the amount of information they need to memorise;
- Additional exams to give students a second chance to sit a paper if the main exams or assessments are missed due to illness or self-isolation; and
- A new expert group to look at differential learning and monitor the variation in the impact of the pandemic on students across the country.

More details will follow, as the Ofqual consultation is ongoing; however, our main IGCSE examination board has already stated they intend to apply similar arrangements to their IGCSE examinations. We will keep the situation under review, yet the fact that we have had uninterrupted provision this term (and that feedback about work completed during lockdown was very positive), should encourage our students to feel reassured and confident about their future.

Car Park, drop off and pick up

You will be aware from my previous Principal's newsletters that cars on site present us with challenges in terms of maintaining the safety of our students and visitors.

Please find below a polite reminder of the guidance:

- Parents/Guardians with Senior and Sixth Form students should not drive onto the College site from Monday to Thursday between the hours of 08:00 09:00 and 14:30 16:15 and on Friday 08:00 09:00 and 14:30 15.45. (Please note that these have been amended to make things easier, with a clear request that the times are adhered to).
- Exceptions are made for students who have a large musical instrument such as double bass, harp, tuba etc., those who are on crutches, who are carrying large amounts of sports equipment i.e., goalkeeper at hockey or those who have an illness which impacts on their mobility or levels of energy and for which we have a Doctor's letter. In these instances, we ask parents/guardians to drop off before 08:00 and collect after 16:15 (15.45 on a Friday). Should your daughter need adding to the list of students who require special dispensation, please provide a written request to this effect.
- Students are expected to enter or leave the College grounds via Brock Road, Perchards Lane and Rocquettes Lane.
- Please avoid obstructing the drive on **Rocquettes Lane**, which forms the entrance for students to College. This will allow students exiting by bicycle or moped to pull out while you are dropping off and will make pedestrian access safer for all. Our neighbours appreciate your consideration of their need to access their properties.
