#### Covid-19 (flyer attached)

I am asked to share the following with you.

Parents and guardians are advised that COVID-19 testing remains a requirement for early years and educational settings. All under-18s due to attend an early years setting, nursery, school or college within 14 days of their return into the Bailiwick, irrespective of the vaccination status of their parents, must undertake a PCR test within the 48 hour period before their return to those settings and must receive a negative test result before attending. Where this requirement is not met by any scheduled Day 1 or Day 7 testing, an additional test should be requested via <a href="https://www.gov.gg/returntoeducation">www.gov.gg/returntoeducation</a>. These tests are free of charge.

In addition, I also share with you the latest 'flu-like symptoms during a Covid-19 pandemic' flyer. This is an updated flyer which will be shared with any parent collecting a child from College who is being sent home due to presenting any of the symptoms detailed.

Should there be any updated requirements, linked to Covid-19, I will write to you before the Michaelmas term with updated details, to ensure that we are able to continue to keep our community safe and manage the potential spread of this virus.

#### **Returning in September**

Subject to any updated guidance from Public Health, we intend to return to College in September, continuing to adhere to the best practice outlined below:

- Thorough and regular hand washing, not touching the face and coughing into the arm are now accepted practice, in addition to "catch it, bin it, kill it".
- Anyone who has **recently developed** respiratory/flu-like symptoms (cough, sore throat, running or blocked nose, muscle pain, headache, fatigue or a fever, loss of taste/smell or shortness of breath), no matter how mild, should not attend school. This applies to all colleagues and all students.

#### Start of term arrangements on Monday, 6 September 2021:

• **Melrose** Middle Prep to Form III arrive between 08:10 and 08:35 with the normal 'kiss and go' system and enter through the 'cow' door to the Melrose Hall.

Remove arrive for 08:30 and go to Tutor rooms.
Lower Four Tour arrive for 09:00 and go to Tutor rooms.
Lower Five arrive for 10:00 and go to Tutor rooms.
Upper Five arrive for 10:00 and go to Tutor rooms.
Lower Sixth arrive for 09:00 and go to Leaf Centre.
Upper Sixth arrive for 10:00 and go to Leaf Centre.

College will finish as normal at 15:30 for Remove and Lower Four, and 16:00 for all other year groups in the Senior School and Sixth Form.

In Melrose the normal finish times apply.

#### Friday, 17 September 2021

The Senior School and Sixth Form will hold the annual Open Morning on Saturday 18 September, when we hope many of our Senior and Sixth Form students will be ambassadors for the College. College will finish at 14:30, on Friday 17 September for students, from Remove to Sixth Form, to allow colleagues to prepare for Open Morning the next day. Melrose and the Pre-Preparatory Department open events will take place during the following week and during the normal working day.

#### Second-hand uniform

Our PTA are keen to receive clothing to replenish the second-hand uniform shops: they will communicate how to access this next term. They would welcome clean items which your daughter has outgrown. These can be donated at Reception in the first instance. Thank you to parents who have already done this.

#### **Contact with College**

Please contact us and discuss any queries or concerns. In most instances, your first point of contact should be your daughter's class or form tutor, or their year co-ordinator. We will always aim to respond promptly, yet ask you to be aware that the nature of our work is often focused around the classroom, which may prevent us from responding immediately. In the Senior School, you might also like to make a note in your daughter's student planner, which is reviewed weekly by her tutor.

We ask parents to keep us up to date with changes in home circumstances, especially where these occur over the longer summer break. This helps us offer the best support to your daughter on her return and whilst she is in our care.

May I close by sharing my thanks to my colleagues who always go the extra mile, and by wishing you and the whole College community a happy, healthy and relaxing summer, before we reconvene for another busy and exciting Michaelmas term.

Dear Parents and Guardians of The Ladies' College

Operation Encompass is a scheme that runs across the UK in order to provide immediate support for children and young people who are involved in or witness domestic abuse incidents. We are pleased to advise you that with effect from the start of next term (September 2021), schools and colleges in Guernsey and Alderney will be participating in this scheme, which is run jointly with Bailiwick Law Enforcement.

Operation Encompass enables information to be shared with The Ladies' College prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced, any domestic abuse. This allows us to provide appropriate support, dependent on the needs and wishes of the child.

The Designated Safeguarding Lead at College has been trained to enable them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that we are able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have experienced a domestic abuse incident.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our children and young people and we believe adopting this important initiative will be extremely beneficial for all those involved. ## Flu-like symptoms during the COVID-19 pandemic

#### Dear Parent/Carer,

You have been asked to collect your child from school today because they have developed symptoms that could be linked with COVID-19.

We kindly request that you go directly home and phone the Helpline on 01481 756938 or 01481 756969 to get further advice. If necessary, your child may be referred for testing for COVID-19.

Your child must stay off school until their symptoms have resolved (and, if they were required to have a COVID-19 test the result was negative). If your child has, for example, a lingering cough, you should seek advice from a health practitioner before they return to school. This DOES NOT apply to diarrhoea and vomiting – in these cases your child must be symptom free for 48 hours before they return to school.

If your child is tested and you are looking after them, you are advised to isolate away from any member of your household who has not been fully vaccinated until the receipt of a negative result.

Please don't hesitate to contact your GP for further advice, or call 999 in case of an emergency, if your child's health is concerning you or if he/she develops other symptoms.

# How to take a body temperature



### Armpit:

- · Place thermometer tip in centre of armpit
- Tuck your arm against your body for a minute
  - Remove and check temperature



#### Mouth:

- · Place thermometer tip under your tongue
  - · Leave it in place for about one minute
    - Remove and check temperature

- Gently tug on ear to straighten ear canal
- Insert digital ear thermometer into ear canal
  - · Squeeze and hold button for one second
    - Remove and check temperature\*
