Dear Parents and students in **Upper Fifth, Lower Sixth and Upper Sixth**

We are writing regarding a proposal to run a TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language) course after the GCSE or A-level examinations are completed next summer.

The two-day course will run from 09:00 until 16:00 at The Ladies' College on:

Monday 27th June and Tuesday 28th June 2022 (available for all years)

UK-TEFL will provide a TQUK accredited course, which covers a broad curriculum and includes lesson preparation and planning, teaching practice and grammar tenses.

The benefits of the course for students include:

- It is a relevant and interesting addition to the UCAS personal statement
- It has no expiry date and can be used at any time eg. for summer school employment whilst at university or during a gap year
- It supports PGCE applications
- It provides good opportunities for volunteering in the local community

Attendance for the entirety of the two-day course is compulsory and is essential to attain the qualification.

The cost will be £250 per student. This will cover the course itself and travel costs for getting the trainer onto the island. For the course to be viable we need a minimum of eight students, with twenty being the maximum in a group.
