A-level Choices Evening Wednesday 2nd November 2022 - 18:00 to 20:00

Prior to this event, parents and students are advised to watch the subject guidance videos. These videos will offer a clear and concise outline and guide to each subject. The videos for each subject will be available to view on the **A-level Choices Evening 2022-3 Team** and can be accessed via your daughter's device. We encourage you to watch these together. Please ensure that you and your daughter watch all the subject videos that your daughter may be considering before the Choices Evening. Upper Five Mock (I)GCSE examinations

A copy of the timetable will be issued at the end of the Michaelmas term to allow students to prepare their revision schedule.

Upper Five are generally looking very smart in their uniforms, and we ask for your continued support to ensure that they wear their uniform with pride. Students are reminded that jewellery, other than necklaces with religious significance and SOS identity bracelets/discs properly inscribed with the student's name, should not be worn. May we also remind students that they should not be wearing two or more ear piercings and that nose piercings are not permitted. We have acknowledged some changing of hair colour, that, in some cases, is beyond our expectations. Hair colouring should be of a natural colour, and we encourage girls to ensure the tone is not too strong or bright. Please also be aware that college expectations regarding skirt length are for them to be no more than 2 inches above the knee. Some Upper Five students are wearing skirts shorter than this. As girls are likely to continue to grow over the coming year – we ask that, in this case, new / alternative skirts should be worn after half term. Please note that the PTA have some second-hand uniform items available, should you wish to consider this option. I would also request that any nail varnish applied over the half-term break is removed before returning.

Students in Upper Five have adjusted well to being back in College. They no doubt feel the pressures of an important year, but they are in a good position and have the full support of their subject teachers and pastoral team.

The balance between schoolwork, co-curricular activities and, if under-taken, part time employment can be hard to achieve. We are aware that, when students over-commit themselves, it does have an adverse effect on their general well-being and their studies. It is very important for students to have time to relax during the week and at weekends.

Interim Reviews (Upper Five):

These provide an intermediate overview of a girl's performance assessed against the following criteria. There will be two Interim Reports per year for most year groups and they are uploaded to the Parent Portal.

A SMART target will be set after the first Interim in a meeting between the student and their Form Tutor in November, and these are reviewed with their Tutors in the second half of the academic year. Upper Five and Lower Five students will also discuss their individual target grades from each of their subject teachers and the actions and support needed to work towards these. Parents' Evenings will provide an opportunity to review this together.

An Interim contains the following categories:

Knowledge and Skills: Understanding of work covered in that group

- Exceeding expectations Has an excellent understanding of work covered
- Meeting expectations Has a good understanding of work covered
- Working towards expectations Has difficulties in understanding some parts of the work covered

The criteria for awarding each grade is based on the subject knowledge expected and agreed within each department for that group (year or set and not for each individual student). There should be a clear understanding as to what is required at each grade using written criteria that shows progress from one session to another.

Organisation: Arrives to lessons correctly equipped and meets deadlines

- **Meeting** expectations Brings the required equipment and hands work in on time (allow one slip but give a warning either verbally or, preferably, recorded in their homework diary)
- Working towards expectations Has difficulties in bringing equipment etc. to lessons or handing work in on time

- Exceeding expectations Students consistently demonstrate the skills relevant to the activity and at level appropriate to them e.g. reflecting on a test, piece of work or performance and being accountable for their actions; able to research effectively with minimal direction; work collaboratively with others and are self-motivated.
- Meeting expectations Students usually demonstrate the skills relevant to the activity and at a level appropriate to them.
- Working towards expectations Students are still developing skills and may require frequent support from the teacher.

Effort: In lessons

- Exceeding expectations
- Meeting expectations
- Working towards expectations

Target grade:

The final column is the target grade agreed between the student and teacher for that subject.
