This report provides an overview of your daughter's performance in terms of the level that they are currently working at and their agreed target grade, as discussed in the Curriculum Evening last term. Their Tutors and I are discussing with students that this is part of our support and feedback on their progress, building on the target setting they did last term and that will be revisited again in the future after the Lower Five end of year examinations and after the Upper Five Mock examinations. The report contains:

Target Grade

- This is the target grade that your child agreed upon with their subject teachers based on their YELLIS chances graphs shared with you in November. It is a motivational target grade that your child is working towards attaining.

Mid-Term Assessment

- The MTA grade is *not* a predicted grade. It is an early guide to what the student may achieve at the end of a two-year course, based on their performance in a recent assessment(s) and assuming current progress is maintained

Comment

- This is a personalised comment from your child's teacher to suggest ideas for further or continued improvement.

We would ask that you discuss this Mid-Term Assessment report with your child before Thursday. On Wednesday, students will see their reports and complete their thoughts on their progress. This will be followed by individual meetings with their Tutors on Thursday, with a focus on evaluating their progress and supporting them with their targets. They will also be encouraged to speak to their subject teachers where appropriate.
