

## The Ladies' College A-level results, summer 2016

We are delighted to report that students of The Ladies' College who took A-levels this year have excelled once again, with a 100% pass rate.

Forty-nine students sat examinations this summer that will allow them to make choices and take decisions about their future. 45.2% of grades were A\* and A (up 5.1%), 78.3% A\* to B (up 7.9%) and 94.3% A\* to C (up 5.4%).

An impressive thirty-one girls achieved at least ABB and eight of our students scored straight A\* and A grades. Our students' academic results are testimony to their attitude to their studies and their hard work, the dedicated adults who work with them at College and great parental support too. However, our girls are more than just results and we would encourage you to visit our Facebook page or website to get a flavour of the breadth and depth of experiences which demonstrate their interest, engagement, commitment and success.

Laura Smith's straight A\*s in English, History and Psychology and an A in Chemistry will see her go to Oxford to read Law and is particularly impressive.
