#### Overview

The Ladies' College has a long tradition, dating from 1872, to provide education to girls. As such, it is one of the oldest girls' schools where the benefits of single sex provision are provided to ensure that the advantages afforded to boys are also afforded to girls. Indeed, there is significant research to suggest that girls achieve more in a single sex environment. Since 1962 the College has operated as an autonomous grant-aided school under the supervision of its own Board of Governors and the States of Guernsey's Education Department. Girls are encouraged to support, challenge, initiate and, most importantly, influence change.

Our 2016-2017 report reflects, once again, the strong traditions of the College, as well as developments and changes during this period. For a more detailed review, the report should be read in conjunction with our Ilex 2017 magazine, which includes the Principal's Report from Speech Day, held in July 2017.

## Principal's Report

Amongst the many highlights contained in this report, the completion of phase 3, A Gift for Learning and the visit of His Royal Highness The Earl of Wessex got our year off to a flying start! In September, we came back to our new school, with much excitement from the girls as they entered into the new building for the first time. This was repeated a couple of weeks later when the Earl of Wessex visited as part of The Diamond Jubilee of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award and to open The Wessex Wing. He was a good sport, the sun shone, the girls squealed (again), the flags fluttered and we entertained with Duke of Edinburgh's Award Diamond Challenge activities, Music; Fencing and Gymnastics. He was great fun and we thoroughly enjoyed His Royal Highness's visit and his generous and entertaining "few words".

The College's Pre-Preparatory Department continues to grow and develop. We have a growing waiting list and offer high quality provision, as recognised by the States of Guernsey Early Years' Service during their annual inspection. ## **Key Initiatives for 2016 -2017**

#### The Ladies' College, Melrose and Pre-Preparatory Department

- Launch of the Melrose Mindset Six Growth Mindset traits, specifically chosen to meet the needs of our pupils Collaborative, Curious, Risk Taker, Resilient, Initiative, Reflective.
- Weekly Guided Writing and Talk for Writing Sessions to further improve quality of writing.
- Introduction of Numicon as a key Mathematics resource to ensure that all pupils are strong in the fundamentals of Mathematics.

#### **Examinations**

The girls continue to perform extremely well in public examinations and whilst the 'value added' figure must always be the most relevant statistical measure of the quality of education, we are proud of our headline results.

Our position in the Daily Telegraph League Tables put the College in the top 100 schools for GCSE and placed 147 for A-Level results. These are results which clearly demonstrate the College's great provision for students and should give them confidence that the significant combined experience of teachers, (1000 years+) currently in College, can support each of them to develop academic confidence. We moved up 2 places at GCSE and 11 places at A-level in 2017 in the League Tables.

#### Value Added

Good results are a strong tradition of the College and each of our students should be proud of her results and be confident that they represent her very best.

The "value added" figure at GCSE remains high and we respect the amount of time, effort and energy that goes into securing such outstanding results by the girls. All our cohorts make progress in line with or above expectations.

Overall our value added value at GCSE was +0.5, very similar to last year's figure. All subjects added value at GCSE, with core subjects of English, Maths and Science which are taken by all students, all scoring strongly. At A-level, when compared to the ALIS baseline test, the value-added is in line with expectations, based an GCSE results. In simple terms, a student at the The Ladies' College is likely to achieve higher than if she were educated elsewhere.


All Melrose pupils took part in the Art, French, Music, Choral Speaking and Literary Sections gaining both individual and group trophies.
