She is a highly successful businesswoman in her own right and I wanted to take this opportunity to say thank you to her on behalf of the whole College, as well as personally. Kate has always found the right balance of support, encouragement, guidance and challenge to the work we do here and to me personally, for which I am incredibly grateful. I genuinely believe that if you put your heart and soul into something, you will always leave a part of you behind when you move on. And so it is that, whilst Kate's official responsibility for College will soon cease, I am confident she will stay in touch and remain part of our community. On behalf of us all I extend our gratitude to Kate and our very best wishes for the future.

Uniform

It has been good to receive some positive feedback about how smart the girls look in their uniform from people outside of College. We have reminded girls of the need to wear their uniform with pride. The most common conversations we have with the girls about incorrect uniform involve our clearly-stated expectations that skirts are worn at the correct length, hair is fully tied back and only one small pair of earrings is worn. These conversations can be easily avoided by simply meeting the requirements which we have reiterated to parents and students many times. We have explained to the girls that uniform applies to and from College, as well as within it. Whilst it is not anticipated to be the norm, if your daughter needs to change out of uniform after school, that can be agreed with their Tutor or Year Co-ordinator in advance.

In respect of uniform expectations for PE lessons, please also be aware that earrings should be removed for all forms of physical activity and if your daughter is unable to remove them, they must provide their own tape and ensure they are covered before the start of the activity.

Once again, thank you for your support in encouraging your daughter to meet expectations.

Reminder for students using inhalers and epipens

We have several students who use specific medication in College and our medicines policy is available on the website. If your daughter is one of the students who needs to have medication with them, such as epipens or inhalers, we request that she takes responsibility for remembering to take this with her when she goes off-site this for any reason, e.g. on trips, to Beau Sejour or to the astro for hockey.

Bring your own device (BYOD)

We intend to ask our new Remove students to bring a tablet device, as opposed to a phone, in September 2019 and will roll out this policy in due course to other year groups. Whilst we still have some final details to explore before this can be shared with you, I would ask that you do not spend money on a new tablet device for your daughter until we communicate further detail next term. I hope that this might make the transition to the new devices more manageable and ultimately more affordable.

Mobile phones

We have also had a few cases where a student has called their parent directly on their mobile to say that they are unwell. Could I respectfully ask you to remind your daughter to go to Reception if she is unwell and if she does call you to reiterate this and await a call from our Reception before coming to College to collect her. Our Reception colleagues are fully trained and have a good understanding of how to support the girls and assess what might be the best course of action. I can assure you that we will contact you if it is something which we feel should be shared immediately.

Group Call / Parent Hub

Please be aware that over the next few months the Group Call facility which we use to send communications home will be discontinued and replaced by a new communications tool called Parent Hub. You can find information on how to sign up to this app on the College webpage under "Information". We plan to trial with the weekly bulletin initially, which will be sent through using both systems. We will also run workshops next term if you would prefer direct help with this. From September 2019, the Group Call facility will cease to be used in Melrose, Senior School and the Sixth Form.

The Core lunch card

Could we request that you keep your daughter's Core lunch card in credit. If your daughter uses the card every day, please think about ensuring there is enough money on the card to see them through the term, to avoid them going into deficit.

Charity support

The students at College are every generous with their support of charities and we are privileged to have a very active Charities' Committee run by the students and supported by colleagues and parents. Over the past few months we have raised funds and held events for Schools4Freedom, the Tumaini Fund and Comic Relief. From the Ball in January 2019 we raised £4000 for the Schools4Freedom charity and presented a cheque to them recently at a special assembly. During the week of International Women's Day, we held another Tumaini Fund event in the Leaf Centre making hygiene packs for the girls in Kagera, Tanzania, and our recent Strictly Come College Dancing competition raised over £1000 for Comic Relief. Thank you to all of you who supported these events.

PTA

The Senior School PTA has a few special events planned in addition to their usual calendar of events. These can all be viewed via our College website. I wanted to make you aware of two special events in June and dates for your diaries.
